# When Bicycling—Obey the Rules of the Road

## BICYCLING ON THE ROAD

Minnesota State Statute 169.222: Operation of a Bicycle

- **Traffic laws apply**: All bicyclists shall have the same rights and duties applicable to vehicles riding on the roadway.
- Riding rules:
  - \* Ride as close to the right-hand curb or edge of roadway,
  - \* Bicycles must travel the same direction of traffic when in the roadway
  - \* Bicycles shall not impede traffic when in the roadway
  - \* Bicycles operating on a sidewalk shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and shall give an audible signal when passing a pedestrian when necessary
- **Bicycle equipment**: for night riding, bike or operator must be equipped with a headlamp and rear reflector visible from a distance of 500 feet away
- **Turning, lane change**: an arm signal to turn left or right shall be made before turning

#### **BIKE SAFETY**

- Protect your head—wear a helmet
- 2. Stay visible—wear bright colored clothing, have lights and reflectors on your bike
- 3. Stay alert—watch out for obstacles in your path
- 4. Go with the flow—bike in the direction of traffic
- 5. Don't get distracted—don't listen to music or talk on the phone while riding
- 6. Obey all traffic laws and lights
- 7. Assure bicycle readiness—make sure your bike seat is properly adjusted, tires are properly inflated, and brakes are in proper working order
